


Colorado River District 75 Years Protecting Western Colorado Water 1937 state statute

Denver Water Interests

- Permitting and construction of Moffat expansion (Gross Reservoir enlargement)
- Resolve Blue River Decree Issues
- Environmental Stewardship

Participation in the WISE Project

West Slope Interests

- Streamflow protection and restoration
- Water for future consumptive use
- Resolve Blue River Decree issues
- Protection of recreation assets






West Slope Interests

- Preserve the Shoshone flow regime
- East Slope conservation and reuse
- Define the Denver Water service area
- Protect future water supplies for WS





😽 Colorado River Basin



Key Provisions Denver Water fixes its service area

- Denver Water commits to further reuse and conservation
- Denver Water provides \$25 million and 1,000 acre feet of water for impacts
- Denver Water allows for further consumptive use in Grand & Summit Counties



Key Provisions


- Denver Water agrees to limit future projects to cooperative ones
- Denver Water agrees to support the Shoshone Outage Protocol
- All parties agree to a Green Mountain administration settlement
- All parties agree to support the WISE Project
 Colorado River District

Key Provisions Denver Water and contract holders agree to West Slope "abstentions"

- Colorado River Enhancement Fund
- West Slope and Denver agree to a Blue River Decree Settlement
- Certain parties agree to a Grand County Streamflow Plan




Shoshone Outage Protocol



Fall





- If a Shoshone outage occurs, Denver and the River District agree to operate Williams Fork and Wolford Mountain as if the plant were still running
- Asking Reclamation to do the same with Green Mountain (WS pool)



Related Agreements

- Amendments to Windy Gap Agreement to cover Windy Gap Firming (Northern Water's Municipal Subdistrict)
- Green Mountain Reservoir Fill Administration Settlement (includes State of Colorado and Bureau of Reclamation)
- Shoshone Outage Protocol (includes Northern Water, Bureau of Reclamation and the State)




